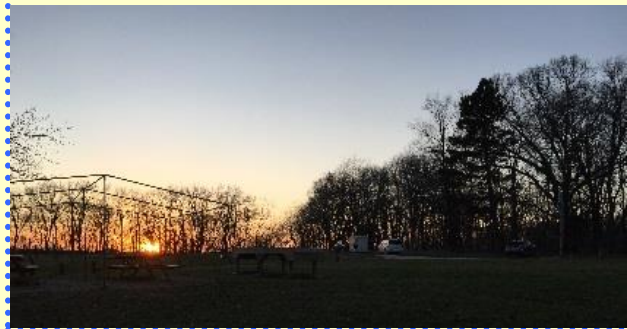

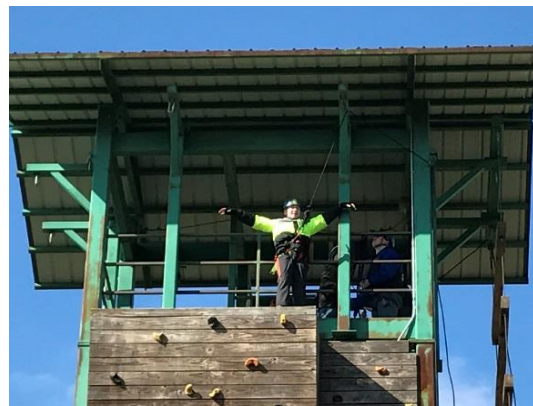
Pete Boehle and Tim Joynt – Got Class B CDL Permits! Now Just a Road Test away from being our Bus Drivers.

Key Items for Cache Lake.

- 1 Third Payment of 125.00 Dollars is due on April 24.
- 2 If you need a passport or border card - apply now! June is just a hop skip and jump away! - All Scouts can travel with a birth certificate and State Picture ID - so do not worry but get it done!
- 3 Make sure you get your medical form and physical scheduled. Turn in May 18th.
- 4 ~~Boater Safety courses are Feb 25 and March 4th.~~ - Completed! On Line Course if Needed Now through May.
- 5 Swim Test Is April 17th at 4 Seasons - No Charge - It is good for Ingersoll as well!
- 6 Camping with the Group - ALL TROOPS - Participate in April 28 -29 - 30
- 7 Need to have All Forms for Travel and Consent and Medical by the 18th of May.
- 8 Troop Rosters are submitted on April 20. So you need to get on the Roster.
